- Your social, sporting etc. activities and any other interests or achievements.
- Any other information which you consider supports your application.

SECTION B should outline:

- The economic, social or other disadvantage, including disability, experienced by you or your household which you feel may impede you in, or prevent you from, studying Architecture. (For further details of the considerations which may constitute disadvantage, please see page 2 of the Information Leaflet on the Scholarship).
- The support and assistance, to overcome the barrier of disadvantage, you think you may need to study the subject.

Note: Please use a black pen or type and ensure that your statement is legible. Instead of providing your statement on the form supplied, you may prepare a statement on a separate sheet or sheets and enclose it with your application. Please note that your statement as a whole should not exceed 500 words.
